Message from the Mayor

I take this opportunity to highlight a few of the most recent happenings around the shire to keep our community informed. **Hanging Rock**

Council has resolved to work with the state government to secure a sustainable income source for Hanging Rock Reserve by using a portion of the East Paddock to provide privately funded accommodation, conference and tourism facilities. We will keep the community informed of progress with this project, which will ensure that Hanging Rock can financially support itself into the future in relation to conservation work and maintenance of infrastructure.

Gisborne Early Years Hub

Council has agreed to cease further investigation of the pine plantation in Gisborne as a potential site for an early years hub until a response is received from the state government on whether Council can acquire the land. We will continue to advocate for the remaining portion of the site to be made available for the cemetery. Council will start the development of a master plan for the UL Daly Reserve including a footprint for an early years hub later this year.

Kyneton Daffodil and Arts Festival

The official opening of the Kyneton Daffodil and Arts Festival took place on 5 September. Congratulations to all involved in the organisation of this fantastic community event. The festivities on offer this year include art and craft exhibitions, flower shows, performances, open gardens and galleries, markets, tours and of course the grand parade, street celebration and fair.

Walking and Cycling Strategy

Council has recently embarked on the development of a Walking and Cycling Strategy. The strategy will provide direction to Council on opportunities to increase walking and cycling participation and improve infrastructure over the next ten years. We are inviting community input, noting that online surveys and public submissions are to be received by 27 September.

Excellence Award

I am pleased to advise that Council recently won an Award for Excellence for a technological improvement that involves the use of tablet computers instead of paper forms when conducting aged care assessments in people's homes. It is expected the new technology will result in a 50% increase in client assessments. The award was granted by the Municipal Association of Victoria and recognises team achievements in technological innovation for improvements to service delivery

Kvneton Airfield

Council will shortly commence a strategic review of the Kyneton Airfield, after the state government announced a \$30,000 contribution to the project through its Regional Growth Fund.

The economic opportunities analysis will explore the airfield's current usage and consider opportunities for future uses. We will ensure that effective and robust community consultation is undertaken throughout the project.

Grant Writing Workshop

Council is hosting a free two hour 'hands on' grant writing workshop in Kyneton on 30 October from 7pm to assist community groups in preparing successful grant applications. It will focus on Council's annual Community Funding Scheme application process and provide tips and techniques on how your community group can improve your chances of receiving grants. A BIG MILESTONE FOR OUR ROMSEY BANK

The Macedon Ranges Shire has now given the green light to the next stage of the exciting project to establish a "Bank of the Future" in Romsey - and the town is set to benefit. "These works set the scene for the project to move to the construction stage," he said. "This will create significant employment opportunities for building trades companies and suppliers in the region."

"When the project is put out to tender, our Bank company will be encouraging local companies to participate in the process and submit a bid. Over more than 10 years our Bank company has demonstrated its commitment to the growth, development and business opportunities for the communities of Lancefield, Romsey and surrounding area, and job creation is a vital component. While tenders for our project will be assessed on a range of criteria including

price and value for money, I expect that there will be abundant opportunities for local businesses and companies to be part of it."

The project will be managed by building design company Bill Jacobs Pty Ltd, and tenders are expected to be issued in the next few months. Mr McCarthy also called for expressions of interest from companies and businesses wishing to lease or buy shops or space in the development.

"This is an excellent opportunity to get in on the ground floor in a modern development on a prime site right in the heart of the Romsey commercial business district," he said.

Lancefield & Romsey Community Financial Services, the company which operates our two local bank branches on behalf of our 500 local shareholders, bought the site in May 2010 to secure our future in Romsey and make a significant contribution to the expansion of the business and retail precinct. Running *To* or *From*?



Any time a teen runs away, it's a complicated situation. It usually feels like it came out of nowhere. But many times they may have tried to communicate something that will give parents a clue as to why they ran away.

If it's happened to you, consider thinking through some of the things your child might be responding 'to': Could running away be a symptom of a family structure that's broken? Is your child running away from something that is difficult? Are they being abused (if this is the case unfortunately no one usually knows about it). Are they not being respected or valued? Is there something going on that you don't know about?

On the other hand, they could be running 'to' something. Maybe your child wants to express their independence or punish your family. They could be running toward a dream, or to another person whom they think can help them achieve their dreams.

Every parent needs to take the time to figure out if something needs to be fixed. If it's not fixed, the child will continue to run away. And as much as it seems like the child running away is the only problem, it's really just a symptom of a bigger problem.

When a teenager decides to run away from the household, it traumatizes the entire family

Despite your worry, anger, frustration etc. they will only come back home if the family leaves the light on for them. 

Look at the birds.

That's what you said, Lord.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life?"

Reflection from Eddie Askew.

It was cold, down at the nature reserve. The sky was steel grey, clouds torn by an almost gale-force wind. It ripped through the trees, scattering the last leaves. The water was grey and ruffled. A great armada of Canada geese was in the water, together with dozens of other waterbirds. They all floated there, facing into the storm.

Their environment had suddenly become hostile, threatening. They didn't protest, or run for cover. They didn't use up precious energy flying into it, or fighting it. They faced into the wind, paddling quietly. They paddled just enough to keep their direction and position in the water.

Maybe we can learn from the birds. Jesus thought so. They tell us of God's concern, he said, and remind us that we achieve little by worrying.

When the going gets tough, the tough gets going, says the Cliché. I'm not sure that's always the best way. We're not all as aggressive as that suggests. Another way is just to face the storm, and keep position. Not scream and shout, not protest and ask what have I done to deserve this, but just hold on to faith and wait for the wind to blow itself out. It will, because the creator of the winds is stronger than the wind.

It may take time, but it works, and I don't remember ever seeing a Canada goose with acute depression.

And there they are, just getting on with the business of living. Being birds. Facing the storm. That's part of my problem, I reckon. Not content to be me, wanting something different. Creating my own tensions. Piling up the building blocks of discontent.

Making my own high-rise apartments of unhappiness.

Isolating myself in anxiety.

Made worse when the hand of reality gives it all a push,

and I sit, a child in the ruins, howling.

Help me understand, Lord,

that wherever I'm at, you're there.

That you have something for me.

That you care.

As a hen gathers her chicks under her wings,

vou said.

Nice picture, that,

Safe from the world, warm, secure.

But chicks grow up, and so must I

Get out into the cold wind of the world out there.

But knowing that your wings are stronger than the storm I think I can live with that.






