





Cover your water meter to avoid freezing

Western Water is advising customers to put a cover on their water meter when frost is predicted to avoid a frozen me-

A frozen meter can mean no water for your household until the meter thaws out, so the best option is to ensure it doesn't freeze.

There are plenty of options for covering your meter, including a large bucket, cardboard box, half a tyre, a hessian bag or an old blanket.

The important thing is to ensure the meter is fully covered to trap the warmer air inside, and that the cover can be easily removed for meter reading and maintenance.

To stop pipes from freezing, first ensure they are clean and not leaking, then wrap in insulation material (available from hardware shops).

Romsey Kindergarten receives funding boost

Macedon Ranges Shire Council has this week welcomed a Victorian Government decision to allocate \$120,000 to rebuild the Romsey Kindergarten playground.

Member for Macedon, Mary-Anne Thomas attended the kindergarten on Monday to make the announcement alongside children and families of the service. The announcement follows a pre-election commitment made by the Labor party last year to fund upgrades at Romsey and Swinburne Avenue kindergartens.

Funding will support the playground upgrade including new areas for creative play and shaded zones. Fencing between both play areas will be removed to bring children together and overall improvements will be made to access, both in and around the facility.

Mayor, Cr Anderson has attributed the funding boost to the commitment of state and local government in responding to the needs of local families.

"This is another great example of how partnering with Victorian Government can lead to positive outcomes for the community."

"Together we are developing modern and flexible early childhood facilities that nurture the wellbeing and development of children. There is a significant amount of work being done in this area and we hope there will be more opportunities in the future."

Romsey Kindergarten now joins several other kindergartens in the shire to receive funding for facility improvements over the last few years, including \$5.3 million in Victorian Government and Council funding towards upgrades to Kyneton, Macedon, Riddells Creek, Swinburne Avenue and Woodend kindergartens, and the development of a new Early Learning Centre in Gisborne.

"By improving early years facilities, we are making the Macedon Ranges an even better place for families to raise their children," said Cr Anderson.

Council will contribute in-kind support to the project through a detailed planning process.

Works are expected to start towards the end of the year following consultation with families and staff.

"Project Romsey" Update

Subsequent to the Romsey Community Streetscape Forum, RRBATA has met with Macedon Ranges Shire Council's (MRSC's) Economic Development and Tourism Unit as well as MRSC's CEO Peter Johnston, Sophie Segafredo (Manager Strategic Planning and Environment) and Dale Thornton (Director Assets and Operations). These meetings have been very helpful to define the groundwork which needs to be done by both RRBATA and MRSC ahead of RRBATA's Streetscape Community Forum No.2. Council has agreed to facilitate development of a Master Plan which will give us a template for constructive task formulation and realization.

Streetscape Forum No.2 has been set for Wednesday 19th August 2015 to be held, again, at the Romsey Community Hub. This will allow time for a draft Master Plan to be formulated for discussion at the Forum. It is anticipated that this forum will result in interested community members joining subcommittees/working parties to address the specific focus areas of streetscape development as identified at the first Forum.

In the meantime, a newsletter documenting information from discussions with stakeholders and outlining the way forward will be sent monthly to all of those community members on the Forum No.1 mailing list. It will also be posted on Romsey Online (www.romsey.org.au).

Romsey Skate Park Art Installation

The recent completion of the art installation in the Lions' Reserve (skate park) has received much comment and media coverage. In the context of RRBATA's initiation of the Romsey Streetscape discussion, RRBATA has met with MRSC's Arts and Culture Officer, Ms. Robyn Till. A positive discussion was had, and a number of extra questions were forwarded to her regarding the process



associated with the acquittal of the \$25,000 MRSC grant which resulted in "Shed Inspiration". RRBATA welcomes art and culture initiatives in the Romsey region and has identified this in the Streetscape Discussion Paper. However, whilst acknowledging that the appreciation of any "art" is very subjective, RRBATA's enquiries relate mainly to the process which has resulted in this particular out-

come. Following the enquiries made to Arts and Culture, RRBATA has written to MRSC to request reflection on the community engagement process in this case.

The church has had an interesting history dating from the mid 1800's, when the Presbyterian and Methodist pioneering people began settling in the Lancefield-Romsey area. To satisfy their spiritual needs, two clergymen, Rev. James Forbes, Rev. William Waterfield and later Rev. Peter Gunn, rode their horses around the bush. Services were held in homes and later, as numbers increased, in farm barns.

The earliest recorded meetings of the general committee was on 3rd March, 1862. In October 1863, a Kirk session was formed with Peter Mitchell, James Ochiltree, Joseph Andrew and James Stewart as Elders.

In 1864, a grant of land to build the church was received. The foundation stone was laid on

same vear.

Peter Mitchell was secretary of the building committee and Mitchell was secretary and treasurer of the church for fifty

Our auxiliary is continuing our fundraising efforts with some exciting purchases to occur this year. Not everyone knows that Ambulance Victoria only provides regional stations and vehicles with basic equipment. This is where your local auxiliary is important. We work closely with Station officer and Mica paramedic David Newman to endeavour to provide the paramedics with the latest medical and training equipment. Our aim this year is to purchase some

training mannequins so the paramedics can keep up to date with specialized procedures. We are also looking to purchase 2 AEDs (Automatic external defibrillator) for the community. An AED is a portable electronic device that is used to shock the heart back into a normal function when the heart stops pumping as a result of a cardiac arrest. The use of an AED in the first 3-5 minutes of a person suffering a sudden cardiac arrest dramatically increases the patient's chances of survival. These devices cost \$2300 each.

Current staff at the Romsey station is 10 and the community can be assured that they have access to the latest equipment. Medical equipment is expensive and this is why we always rely on the community to help us raise funds. Thank you to everyone who supported our Mothers day raffle. We raised \$500 and the lucky winner was Pat Carlton.



A young man growing up in the wrong part of Houston became a bully. He would get in fights in school, in the neighbourhood, and began mugging people to get spending money. He even beat up people just for the sake of doing it.

He learned to box, and became pretty good at it. He began to make a lot of money and could have almost anything he wanted. One day, during his training session for an upcoming bout, he heard his mum talking to his sister on the telephone about his favourite nephew. The young boy had had a seizure and now lay in a coma in the hospital. Doctors said he would probably die, but that if he came out of the coma he wouldn't be able to move his limbs, or speak, or do any of the human functions we consider part of living.

He ran into the room where his mum was on the phone and shouted, "Mamma, call the hospital and tell those doctors to give him the best of everything. Tell them I'll take care of all the bills, to fly in the best doctors from wherever they have to. Tell them who I am, and that I'll take care of everything — whatever it costs."

His mum spoke to the doctors, and then told him, "Son, you're just going to have to pray."

He realized then how grave the situation was. When someone tells you the only thing you can do is pray, things are looking pretty bad.

Then it hit him. All of his money, his fame, his influence, his friends — none of that could solve this problem. It was out of his hands, out of the doctor's hands, out of everyone's hands. For the first time, he was totally powerless.

And for the first time, George Foreman dropped to his knees and prayed.

The Spirit of Power that we receive when we rely on Jesus for our lives is not like the human power that we recognize as strong. It's a power unlike anything we can do on our own


