Recipe

1tsp baking powder

1 cup small white (or milk/dark) chocolate bits

Melt the butter in a medium saucepan, stir in cocoa, vanilla and salt. Remove from heat and allow to cool slightly. Quickly whisk in the eggs, fold through sifted flour and baking powder. Mix in choc bits. Spoon the mixture into a greased and lined 18x28cm slab tin. Bake at 170 degs for 25-30 mins. The mixture will seem soft but the outside will harden on cooling. Change to Romsey water supply

Bore water has been reintroduced to Romsey water supply this month.

Western Water General Manager of Customer and Community Relations Graham Holt said the Romsey supply had been 100% surface water since March, using water made available through the Romsey-Lancefield pipeline connection to Western Water's broader supply network.

"However, poor inflows in 2015 have seen the surface water levels drop in local reservoirs. Using some bore water in the Romsey supply system will preserve local surface water until the reservoir levels recover."

Mr Holt said the amount of bore water in Romsey's supply will be around a quarter of the overall supply.

With low proportions of bore water in the supply, it is unlikely that customers will notice any changes to the taste or odour of their water, Mr Holt said.

Low levels of fluoride, from water in storage reservoirs, may be found in town supplies until reservoir levels recover.

All water supplied by Western Water is safe to drink and is fully compliant with the Australian Drinking Water Guidelines.



ARE YOU A RESISTANCE FIGHTER?

No, we're not talking about terrorism, politics or even parenting toddlers, but your health. It is to consider how fighting off a menacing resistance can keep us healthier in the long run.

You may have recently come across media reports of 'super bugs' plaguing our hospitals and potentially threatening our lives, should we become infected. Whilst these scary stories focus upon bacteria that currently seem untreatable, there is a much more common version of the same problem here in Romsey; antibiotic resistance.

Since penicillin was first discovered last century, antibiotics have played a major role in the health of our community. Prior to this, in the 1920s for example, the most common cause of death was pneumonia – an infection of the lungs usually caused by bacteria. Penicillin and other subsequent antibiotics have helped ensure bacterial infections such as pneumonia, bladder infection, whopping cough, and cellulitis can be effectively treated in the community without the need for hospitalisation.

Over time, we have become used to using antibiotics for many infections, and a lot of these were not caused by bacteria but by viruses (such as for sore throats, colds, the flu, gastro), where antibiotics actually have no effect. To be honest, that last statement isn't exactly true – whilst the antibiotics have no effect on the illness, they do have an effect on our health. In addition to common side effects such as nausea, diarrhoea, allergy and thrush, we are developing more bacteria that are becoming resistant or 'immune' to the antibiotics that once effectively killed them. As a result bacterial infections that were once easily cured with antibiotics are becoming harder to treat.

So what can be done?

One of the first steps is to become better informed. The National Prescribing Service has some great information. You can find this here: www.nps.org.au/medicines/infections-and-infestations/antibiotics.

See your GP if you have symptoms of high fevers, along with difficulty with, or painful, breathing - these symptoms may suggest pneumonia. If you are prescribed antibiotics, it is important that you follow your GP's advice on when, how, and for how long to take them, in addition to whether alcohol will affect your antibiotics.

If you have a cold (runny nose, tiredness, sore throat, cough, headache, body aches) then your GP will be able to ensure there's (hopefully) nothing more serious and reassure you. Antibiotics for these symptoms will not help, and are harmful for all of us in the long run. Antibiotic medications are important. Let's avoid them when they aren't necessary, so we don't run of options when we really need them.



C H O I C E S A TALE OF TWO CITIES SODOM & JERUSALEM

SODOM. (Jerusalem, next month). Abram (Abraham), now very prosperous, and his nephew, Lot and their families had settled in Canaan and their numbers had so increased the land was unable to support the two family groups. Abram graciously asked Lot to choose where he preferred to go - Lot chose the plain of Jordan "which was well-watered and like the garden of the Lord".

Lot pitched his tents near the city of Sodom. "Now the men of Sodom were wicked and sinning greatly against the Lord." (Genesis 13:13.) The people of the Jordan plain, because of their vile and corrupt life-styles, had become detestable in God's eyes, His judgement fell upon them, despite His long-suffering and mercy over a very long period, yet they still did not repent of their despicable ways. Judgement came in the form of an earthquake which destroyed the entire region, only Lot and two daughters escaping, gone was the "garden of the Lord" leaving only the desolate area around the Dead Sea. Did Lot make a right choice? His life ended in ignominy - his two daughters, fearing the end of the family line, after getting him drunk, committed incest with him. Their two sons, Moab and Ben-Ammi - the father of the Ammonites - growing down the years became bitter enemies of the Israelites. (Genesis 19). God's judgement came down on Sodom and the region for their sinful, wilful ways even though, "the Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love."



Romsey Uniting Church



We are all looking forward to meeting up with part Ministers and Thends will be attending the 150th Anniversary of the Blue Stone Church at 25 Pohlman Street, Romsey, on Sunday the 16th of August. The Church service will commence at 10.30am including Communion followed by a spit part of the Mechanics Hall at 12.30pm.

The church has had an interesting history dating from the mid 1800's, when the Presbyterian and Methodist pioneering people began settling in the Lancefeld Romses at an Worship

To satisfy their spiritual needs, two clergymen, Rev. James Forbes, Rev. William Waterfield and later Rev. Peter Gunn, rode their horses around the bush. Services were held in homes and later, as numbers increased, in farm barns

The earliest recorded meetings of the general committee was on 3rd March, 1862. In October 1863, a Kirk session was formed with Peter Mitchell, James Ochiltree, Joseph Andrew and James Stewart as Elders.

In 1864, a grant of land to build the church was received. The foundation stone was laid on 3rd March, 1865 by William Campbell, and the church opened in July of the same year.

Peter Mitchell was secretary of the building committee and the stone was quarried locally from his property. Mr. Mitchell was secretary and treasurer of the church for fifty years.

On Pentecost Sunday 29th May, 1977, a celebratory service was held in the already merged Romsey Presbyterian – Methodist church, to celebrate the beginning of the Romsey Uniting Church.





REVISION TO MEDAL REPLACEMENT RULES A WIN FOR VICTIMS OF FIRES

Labour Member for McEwen, Rob Mitchell, today welcomed a move to allow easier access to replacement Defence service medals if they are lost in circumstances outside the control of their custodians.

Since 2003 service awards of deceased individuals could only be replaced if they were lost in specified natural disasters. Now, the revision of this policy means that medals of deceased individuals can also be replaced in the following circumstances:

- The loss, damage or destruction of the medals occurs in circumstances beyond the control of the holder of the medals; for example as a result of a house fire or theft.
- The loss, damage or destruction occurred after 1 December 1974.

Service medals will only be issued to the holder of the deceased individual's medals.

The medals cannot be replaced in circumstances where an individual has died and the medals cannot be found. "It's an unfortunate reality, particularly in the areas in which we live, that fires can and do occur," Rob Mitchell said. "The heartbreak brought on by these types of disasters is tough enough without having to deal with the loss of your family's service medals. I have seen the situation all too often when families have lost this valuable connection to the past. This easing of the circumstances in which medals can be replaced means that more families will be spared this heartache."

Medals replaced by Defence will be engraved with the initial "D" to denote "duplicate"


